The website now shows the interment right expiry date as "not applicable" and that the interment right will be maintained by the Department of Veterans Affairs. This is now the bench-mark for all of SA and interstate. We all know our tenure on this earth is short and everyone here is living the bonus. So to get this done, with the help of Sir Eric Neale, Bill Denny and Jan Stacey, is quite an achievement.

Behind the front lines of the Somme, Vignacourt was a staging point, casualty clearing station and recreation area for troops. Captured on glass, printed into postcards and posted home, these photographs enabled Australian soldiers to maintain a fragile link with loved ones in Australia.

RETURN TO VIETNAM

- after which the French departed.
- Then on to Khe Sanh and Hamburger Hill, rarely visited, and sites of major American battles.
- South to Saigon and Vung Tau. No ferry these days to Vungers - bus trip only at the moment.

'Wheelie' Binh Nguyen, our former guide, met the group in Hanoi and was able to get them in to other rarely-visited sites. Good to know that Wheelie has a baby son, Anh.

BERNIE BINDER COMMEMORATIVE SERVICE ALBURY 27th OCTOBER, 2014

On Monday 27th October, 2014, 10 Platoon conducted a commemorative service at Monument Hill, Albury NSW to mark the 45th Anniversary of the death of Private Bernard Binder.

Bernie came to 10 Platoon on 6th August, 1969, and was initially employed as the platoon signaller before moving to 3 Section as No. 2 on the machinegun.

During his short time in 10 Platoon he was involved in 10 Platoon operating with 3 Cavalry Regiment near Xuyen Moc before patrolling down and up the Song Rai on assault boats and went to Vung Tau for R in C for the first and last time 17th to 19th September, 1969 (see picture).

Then it was out to Hat Dich on Operation Jack; Bernie's last operation. The wet season was at its peak with thunderstorms a regular occurrence. It was during one of those thunderstorms late in the afternoon of 27th October, 1969, that the Claymore mine that Bernie was carrying detonated and he was killed instantly.

It was poignant that at Bernie's service 45 years later there were thunderstorms all morning until just before the service when they stopped until the end of Bernie's service when they recommenced.





As part of the 2015 Anzac Commemoration, the 5000 Poppies project will be "planting" a field of more than 100,000 poppies in Federation Square, Melbourne, as a stunning visual tribute to Australian servicemen and women for more than a century of service in all wars, conflicts and peacekeeping operations.

In Port Pirie, Laraine reports that many craftswomen from the local community gather regularly at the RSL to make the poppies and share special remembrance time together. They have amazing plans to display the poppies at the Museum.

In Goolwa, Betty is keeping her fingers busy

making poppies for a grand local project - the plan is to cover the 8 pillars of the Memorial Arch.

In Strathalbyn, Jan reports that crafters are busy making poppies for the project in Melbourne and for a Centenary of Anzac Family and Community Tribute on Sunday afternoon 31st May.

As well as putting a strain on the supplies of red wool at local craft stores, creative ladies are making poppies out of tulle, pre-loved red jackets and raincoats from op. shops, and searching their button boxes for simple poppy centres.

HAVE YOU MADE A VALID WILL?

9 RAR and RAR Association Welfare Officer Lyn Fisher regularly has to deal with complicated problems arising when veterans have not made a will. Please ensure that you make a will and advise your family where the original is filed.

Whether someone has died from accidental death, long or short term illness, or suicide, if they have died without a valid Will, South Australian laws will dictate how the estate will be distributed.

If you cannot locate a Will, the person is deemed to have died 'intestate' (without a valid Will).

If the person who has died intestate has left an estate that requires administration (for example, real estate or superannuation, etc), the estate is dealt with in accordance with the South Australian laws of intestacy. The South Australian laws of intestacy determine who will administer an intestate estate, which may be Public Trustee.

For further information, you could contact the Public Trustee, the Legal Services Commission or a private solicitor or Trustee Company.

A formal occasion but it was delightful to see the Fairhead's 18 month old grandson go to Fred during his speech in response. A lovely family moment to witness as Fred held him for the remainder of the speech.

The event was very well planned and executed by Adrian Craig and the team of volunteers from RARSA and attendees included serving personnel from 7 Bn.

Adrian reports that the vegetation from a number of plants behind the Memorial renders it unsuitable for services where we need to place our banner behind. This will need monitoring as the bushes are out of control.


