The following is a copy of an email sent from 9 RAR Association SA (for those who are not on the internet or maybe missed it).

Greetings to all members of the 9 RAR family.

President David Stacey and the members of the South Australian Association have much pleasure in providing you with the details of the Adelaide Reunion of the 9th Battalion Royal Australian Regiment to celebrate the 50th Anniversary of the Battalion to be held in Adelaide in November 2017.

This launch coincides with the "unveiling" of the website dedicated to the reunion. You can access this site via <u>www.9rarsa.com.au</u> where you will find more details of the reunion.

The primary purpose of this first email is to establish that we have correct emails for all in our address book. Once we have established this, future emails will give you instructions on how to log on so that you can update your information in the "data base" and how you will be able to book and pay on line for the various activities.

However, firstly, if you have received this email and you will be unable to attend the reunion or you have no wish to receive anymore emails about the reunion please reply to this email with the words PLEASE REMOVE ME in your response. We respect your wishes.

In brief the 2017 reunion will be held from Monday 13th November until Wednesday 15th November. The Reunion Dinner will be held on the Monday which is the date of the formation of the Battalion. The Remembrance Service will follow on the Tuesday and be held at Keswick Barracks, the place of formation. The Wednesday activity is a "Picnic" (previously referred to as a BBQ) to be held at Lake Breeze Winery in Langhorne Creek.

The Dinner will be held in the Hilton Hotel Adelaide which is conveniently located in the centre of Adelaide with public transport at the door, including the Adelaide Tram service. Using this venue means that those wishing to avail themselves of accommodation in the hotel have a very easy "trip" home. The format is different from past reunions and has been done for the following reasons:

• The Dinner is being held on the actual day of formation - albeit not a Saturday

• The Meet & Greet is in the guise of informal Company gatherings on the Sunday before thus significantly reducing the cost of the traditional "whole of Battalion" affair.

• The Remembrance Service will be the only activity on the day after the Dinner and will include a light lunch for those wishing to avail themselves and the option of a tour of the Army Museum.

The "Picnic" is so called because food will be available from a variety of outlets rather than simply a BBQ. By splitting the "Picnic/BBQ" from the Service, dress will be informal, rather than the suit and medals attire when the BBQ followed the service.

There will be an optional pre-reunion activity on the Saturday, Remembrance Day, with a visit to the Port Pirie RSL Museum, home of the Huey. The visit will include participation in the RSL Remembrance Day Service.

Our aim is to make this milestone Reunion as affordable as possible so that as many of our family can join in. For many this will be their last reunion and it is important that the Reunion is of the proper standard but affordable for all. We will be encouraging you to support various fund raising activities we intend putting in place. We have and will be applying for Grant Funding to offset the cost of putting the reunion together.




The Royal Australian Regiment Birthday Celebrations 28 - 30 October 2016

#### Friday 28 October 2016 - 9.30am

# 9th Battalion Australian Imperial Force

In the last Niner News (Issue 74), I included the highlights of the Battle of Pozieres and the part that the 9th Battalion played in that assault. The story of Private John Leak VC, the first Queenslander to win a Victoria Cross, was also detailed.

During the year, the 9th Battalion Association Inc has maintained a display, called "First Ashore", at the Milne Bay Memorial Library and Research Centre as part of the Centenary of ANZAC. During this time, they have held a series of Heroes Lectures covering the valour of several 9th Battalion men.

On the 23 July, The Honourable Tom McVeigh gave the lecture on Private John Leak VC.

Several 9 RAR members attended this lecture with Denis Farmer traveling down from Kilcoy. The following are some photos from that lecture.

The main highlight was that John Leak's son, Patrick Leak, travelled up from Adelaide for the lecture and brought with him the original Victoria Cross. It was such an honour to hold the medal and listen to the stories about John Leak from the family.

### Remembrance Day 2016

The following is the Commemoration Poster for this year's Remembrance Day depicting the evacuation of casualties in Phuoc Tuy Province.

The Wartime Snapshots document was taken from the DVA Anzac Portal and provides a good background to the poster.



## WARTIME SNAPSHOTS

Commemorating Australian Forces in the Vietnam War 1962-1975

The Vietnam War was the longest twentieth century conflict in which Australians participated. It involved some 60,000 Australian service men and women, and more than 1600

Australian civilian personnel. Australian involvement in the war began in 1962 with the arrival of the Australian Army Training Team Vietnam (AATV) in July and August. Personnel from all three services contributed to the war. After the end of combat operations in 1972, a small number of Australian personnel remained in Vietnam, and parts of the RAAF returned in 1975, carrying out evacuations and assisting refugees almost until the moment of South Vietnam's surrender. More than 500 Australians died as a result of the war and over 3000 were wounded.

### Background - Operation Massey Harris

The image on the poster shows the evacuation of casualties injured in Operation Massey Harris. Conducted in August and September 1970, the operation aimed to 'find and destroy enemy crop gardens in a large area east of Xuyen Moc in the south-east corner of Phuoc Tuy and neighbouring Binh Tuy province'.

On 29 August – the first day of the operation – an Armoured Personnel Carrier (APC) loaded with soldiers reversed over an anti-tank mine. The explosion threw the vehicle into the air and dropped it onto the rear of a Centurion tank. A South Vietnamese bushman scout was killed instantly and fourteen Australian soldiers and one New Zealander were wounded. Improvements which had recently been made to the APC prevented more severe casualties.

The photograph shows the casualties being evacuated onto a No. 9 Squadron RAAF medical evacuation helicopter. A United States Army dust-off chopper waits in the background to pick up more casualties.

No. 9 Squadron supported every major Australian operation in Vietnam. The squadron undertook more than 200,000 missions: evacuating casualties, inserting and extracting Special Air Service patrols, spraying herbicides and pesticides, dropping leaflets and gathering information.

Operation Massey Harris was part of a strategy to block the enemy's food supply. 'Massey Force' included troops of B Squadron, 3 Cavalry Regiment, supported by a mortar section from 2RAR and infantry of the task force headquarters Defence and Employment Platoon. Men from 8RAR temporarily replaced those injured in the accident on 29 August. Naval gunfire support was provided by a Royal Australian Navy destroyer and two US Navy warships offshore in the South China Sea.

When the operation ended on 20 September, 'over 34 hectares of rice, maize and vegetable garden had been destroyed'. While it succeeded in destroying crops and temporarily driving 'production cell' farmers from the area, the inability to maintain a permanent presence in the area meant that farms could be re-established once the operation had ceased.

The concert included the 1st Regiment, Royal Australian Artillery Band, Wickety Wak, Denise Drysdale, and a moving Remembrance Ceremony.




# The Kilcoy Diggers at Kilcoy Race Club

It offers a quiet place to relax and chill out from the hustle and bustle of the city but also provides contact with the outside world via the 3G network and wireless broadband.


If you wish to camp out under the stars, it is recommended that you bring all the appropriate equipment not forgetting mossie repellent and your personal medication.

On the other hand, there is ample space to accommodate motorhomes, caravans etc. with the alternative of staying in one of the camps cabins.

Limited 12 volt power is available which supplies the camps lighting, generators are permitted but should be used with the consideration of others.

On entering the camp it would be appreciated if you would sign the visitors' book and read the camps standing orders before settling in, additionally, donations are gratefully received to aid in the upkeep of facilities for the camp. There is ample seating and tables available throughout Cockscomb, plus, there are newly installed gas hot water systems providing hot water for both the ablutions and kitchen areas.

Prior to leaving Cockscomb, could you please make sure that you have left the area in a clean and tidy state for the next visitor and replenished all stock that you have used, plus place the monies owed in an envelope into the metal box.


